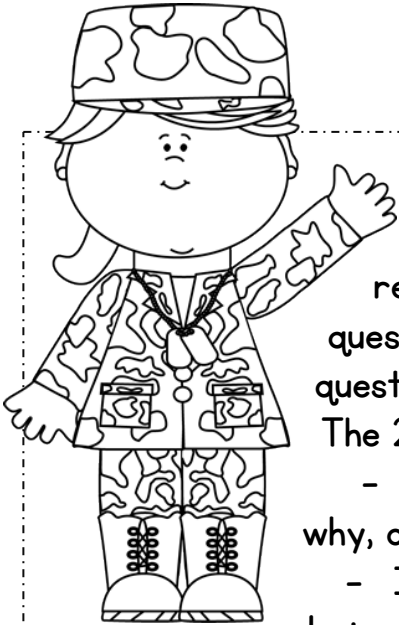

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Reading

We are back to questioning while reading. However, this time instead of questioning while reading literature, we are questioning while reading informational books.

The 2 objectives for the week are:

- I can identify who, what, where, when, why, and how to answer questions in a text
- I can ask and answer questions before, during, and after reading a text.

Students will be working on this by using post-it notes during their reading to record questions that come up as they go. Once the text has answered the question, students mark an A on the post-it note and write the answer.

The biggest goal for this standard is to get students to closely read and to think while they read non-fiction text.

WRITING- REALISTIC FICTION

We are continuing with our realistic fiction pieces. This week, we are going to really focus on how the main character will try multiple times to solve the problem. Just like in real life, it isn't always the first way that a character tries to solve a problem that works. We are also going to focus on different ways to end a story.

Flash Cards

We are really starting to get underway with Rocket Math.

I'm sending home new flash cards this week to help your child study. The cards will need to be cut out.

MATH

We are learning about fractions this week. Students in 2nd grade need to learn how to represent halves, thirds and fourths.

The big overall goal for fractions in second grade is to understand that the shares need to be the same size. A secondary goal is to be able to divide a shape into fractions in different ways.
